## 2011 Pacific Northwest Fish Screen and Passage Workshop September 13-15, 2011 Centennial Center, Cle Elum, Washington

This is a "Save the Date" and "Call for Presentations" for the 2011 Pacific Northwest Fish Screen and Passage Workshop, to be held September 13-15 in Cle Elum, Washington.

The Workshop will provide valuable opportunities for training, networking, and sharing of information. Throughout the workshop, fish screening and passage experts meet to share their accomplishments and successes. Workshop talks will focus on providing opportunities for technicians, biologists, engineers, and shop staff to share their experiences working with a variety of materials in various conditions to install and maintain fish screening and passage structures.

A trade show will provide information on a wide selection of materials and services that are available for use in fish screening and passage applications.

The Workshop will also include tours of screening and passage facilities.

The Workshop is hosted bi-annually by Idaho, Oregon, Washington, or the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, and attendees typically represent a variety of private, state, federal, and tribal interests.
